# From the FOUNDER'S DESK

2018-2019 has been a productive year for TMNP and can be marked as a milestone in the entire journey of TMNP. After spending 18 years in the field TMNP has been able to standardised its thought process in product form. Probably the time has come that this standardised product can be delivered to other like minded organisations. Giftedness Identification Protocol, Giftedness Nurturing material & Giftedness Assessments templates has been successful tested for last three years. Thus I can say that this year is productive with respect to PROCESS STANDARDISATION.

TMNP has spent exclusive time, energy & efforts to create Gifted Nurturing Audio & Video, Gifted Parenting awareness material. This hardship has resulted in more than 100 audio & video's and approximately 450 powerpoint slides. Thus I can say that this year is productive with respect to PRODUCT DEVELOPMENT.

TMNP team has presented its work to Mensa International IBD 2018 at Budapest & received an endorsement letter from the Chair. Similar presentations were done in Germany, Hungary and Netherlands. This I can say that this year has been productive with respect to PRESENTATION.

TMNP has taken some pioneer steps in 2018-19. A special GIFTED CLASSROOM in a normal school was inaugurated in Jan 2019. Unfortunately due to school logistics problems, the class was unable to run for its full period. This setback has created a challenge for us. Now, in 2019-2020, we are all set to run the Gifted Classroom successfully. In association with Maharashtra Institute of Technology( Pune), TMNP a research internship program and now we await the results. TMNP Vanchit, a special program for gifted amongst commercial sex workers, HIV-AIDS affected people was launched. Lack of financial support curtailed the project in its initial stage itself. 21 Gifted has been identified as gifted and waiting for nurturing. Earn & Learn scheme has been initiated to provide financial support & experience to gifted youths. Thus I can say that the year has been productive with respective to PIONEER WORK.

Overall, looking back, I am comfortably able to state that the TMNP model has taken good shape & is ready to provide to other similar, like minded organisations. The TMNp model has been replicated with some modifications by Mensa Delhi (Project Dhruva), Jnanada Vidya Mandir, and Maharshi Karve Schools more to come. Mr. Micheal Feeman, Executive Director Mensa International has showed interest in TMNP to be replicated in African countries.

I request all TMNP team members, associated organisations, schools, donors to keep their constant faith, support, help and guide us in the times to come.

### Mensa India

Mensa India is a non profit organization that aims to identify and bring together the Gifted for societal benefit. Those who score above 98 percentile on the standard Mensa IQ test are qualified as Mensans.

Mensa India is an emerging chapter of Mensa International. It has several chapters across India, TMNP being one of them. Mensa India is the legal entity and a registered charitable trust.

Mensa is the largest and the oldest High IQ society in the world.

## **Tribal Mensa Nurturing Program**

Established in 2002, the journey of TMNP started when 4 Gifted girls were identified, for the first time, from Sevadham AshramShala, Pune.

TMNP primarily focuses on identifying and nurturing gifted children from the socially and economically underprivileged backgrounds. Ever since its inception, TMNP has nurtured more than 3500 such young gifted students to help them understand their abilities and motivate them to reach out to their true potential!

## **European Talent Support Network**

The European Talent Support Network was established by ECHA in its 2014 General Assembly in Slovenia. The Network offers a rich variety of cooperation for organisations active in gifted education and talent support having more than 300 participating organisations from 38 countries all over the world.

In 2016, India became the first country, ever, to be a non-European country affiliated with ETSN.

TMNP was recognised as the Associated European Talent.

& terminology to nurture giftedness.


It's an ongoing process to revisit the same principles to get a deeper sense of the human body-soul relationship.

The principles "Panchakosha" is the heart of TMNP.

Through this principles nurture giftedness to become the "Future Leaders".







# TMNP Panchakosha Model

Taittariya Samhita of Yajurveda (one of the Vedas) describes about 5 sheaths (in Sanskrit, Kosha) of human body. Focusing on these 5 sheaths in nurturing to attain individual potential is the key feature of Tribal Mensa Nurturing Program (TMNP). With the help of educationists, psychologists, the philosophy of Pancha-kosha has been decoded into nurturing activities. This model is an exploratory study with tribal gifted students and the researcher felt Pancha-kosha model was apt as the children come from underprivileged background, from the Indian ethos. This nurturing matches to the cultural context and tribal gifted students to unravel their potential using the 5 sheaths namely Annamaya Kosha (Physical body), Pranamaya Kosha (Five Senses), Manomaya Kosha (Mind), Vidhyanmaya Kosha (Intelligence) and Anandmaya Kosha (Self). Each Kosha was taken in the form of activity e.g. Follow the dietary habits along with spiritual recitations, debates, skits, role plays, movie discussion, eco-walks, painting, yoga, meditation and scientific discussions to enhance their self confidence and hone their talent. The researcher was able to observe the relevance of the model befitting for the tribal Mensa gifted students, as it is holistic.

# INTERNATIONAL OUTREACH



TMNP is not just confined to pioneering ideas and work in the field of underprivileged giftedness, but its nurturing model is just as unique. Converting the ancient knowledge from Indian Vedas into an

Nurturing Model, developed by TMNP, has not only been successfully implemented in India, till date, but also been appreciated across the world.

In order to expand the ideology of TMNP, we travelled around the world to collaborate with some international institutes as well. The cultural interchange adds a new perspective to the various organisations from different backgrounds, yet facing similar challenges.

### **HUNGARY**

Dr. Desai and Dr. Shetti, from TMNP, along with Csilla Fuszek, coordinator of ETSN, visited a school for underprivileged gifted students in Hejőkeresztúr, Budapest. The school is now a benchmark for other schools for gifted children in Hungary. This school was started by Dr. Nagy Emese. Her relentless efforts have caught the attention of the Hungarian education system and are now used as a protocol for other education systems. Dr. Desai and Dr. Shetti saw examples of instruction program by attending a Math and History class during their visit.





Nóra Ritók, the founder of Real Pearl foundation works for the betterment of the underprivileged Roma community. Using art as a medium to create bridges between ethnic minorities and main stream communities Nora uses art (painting) through an after-school academy to bring children from Roma communities together. Dr. Desai and Dr. Shetti visited her NGO and her one of her work sites in an eastern Hungarian village. Her approach of art and creativity to break socio-cultural barriers has brought about a remarkable reform in the local Roma community. With her pioneering work, Nóra has started self-help groups in the community which now produce local handicrafts which include paintings, sauces and locally produced food products. With this initiative she has been successful in motivating parents to educate children and find livelihood for themselves. Paintings done by students from Roma community are available at the NGO along the local with products. Many paintings have received international awards. This experience was very key to understand how work with talent and giftedness in underprivileged communities has resulted in new coping and thriving mechanisms for societal uplifting. This was a very nice model to see how non–academic education and creativity can bring about change in society.



Here, there was a detailed interaction with the director of the school Bíró Gábor, who very kindly spared a lot of time and insights about the school administration. György Bessenyei Secondary School provides high quality education for gifted students who have varied set of talents and coming from different backgrounds. The school also caters for students coming from underprivileged backgrounds. The school and its staff have brought about a very significant reform in education standard with staff evaluation process wherein educating the educator is addressed. This has rendered in a very high quality standard education of this institution. Periodic staff evaluation have made education a very iterative and evolving process.

Dr. Desai also took a lecture about Indian philosophy Dr. Shetti spoke about environmental topics with high school students. The school staff very warmly showed the school, the campus and students training facilities. Director Bíró Gábor is doing extensive work to address students from Roma community (a local underprivileged ethnic minority) for making education easily available and motivating parents from Roma families to educate their children. It was a very enriching experience to visit this school and dormitory.

# TMNP PAVING WAY TO COLLABORATE WITH RADBOUD UNIVERSITY IN NIJMEGEN, NETHERLANDS

Dr. Narayan Desai and Dr. Rohan Shetti visited Nijmegen, University in Netherlands to visit Dr. Lianne Hoogeveen. Dr. Hoogeveen's working group in Nijmegen is addressing a wide variety of topics in giftedness research and education.

From bringing different experts from Europe for giftedness research together to developing a certified teachers training program for teachers and educationalists for handling gifted students (RadboudCSW International Training on High Ability [RITHA]), Dr. Lianne and her group are at the forefront of gifted education. Dr. Lianne and her colleagues have warmly agreed to collaborate with TMNP and we shall soon get the RITHA program for teachers in India. The discussions at the research center were very constructive and motivating. Dr. Hoogeveen arranged for a visit to her research center and also to a school for gifted students (Gymnasium) wherein we met many administrative personnel leading the school. The discussion about screening the students and nurturing talented minds was very informative and enriching.

This collaboration would be an important benchmark as we could address interested institutions from India who are working with talent identification and nurturing with a certification program that could equip teachers to identify and nurture gifted students.





Can a next-door garage provide servicing for a Ferrari? The complexity of the engine as well as its compatibility with the roads and climate affects the performance of even the best machinery.

A Gifted mind faces similar challenges. Peer interactions, ethical dilemmas, extreme emotional sensitivity and a challenging socio-economic family background strangles the creativity of the gifted mind. To understand these challenges faced by the Gifted students, TMNP, in collaboration with Manas Tatva, conducted a pilot project of gifted counselling for 175 Girls.

This helped TMNP identify the trends in challenges faced by the Gifted and solutions by expert psychologist that can be incorporated in nurturing and training.

Manas Tatva, in association with TMNP, is creating Manuals and Protocol for G-Counselling, which will help Psychologists, Counsellors and Educationists to study the challenges faced by Gifted students.

# TMNP Study Skill Workshops





In our nurturing programs, we focus more on the non-academic approach. But through counselling sessions, we realised that the major struggle for these underprivileged students is their outlook towards their performance and marks in academics.

Teaching the gifted is the most challenging job for a teacher, as these are self-explorers and always go beyond their syllabus. The subjects may vary, but the learning techniques is what these students need to learn. Teachers have always praised the improvement in academic performances of the underprivileged students enrolled with TMNP. So this year study-skill workshops were introduced officially at the Mahilashram school for the Std. 10th Class.

These workshops received an overwhelming response from the students and we could instantly see how they applied their giftedness to help their non-gifted peers as well. Students created one-page concept notes, posters and tricks to grasp subjects like Mathematics, Science and English. Some girls shared the responsibility of 5 non-gifted girls, by studying with them and sharing their notes and knowledge. Some students organized study-skill workshops for non-Gifted girls as well. The notes that originated through these workshops were also circulated to all other schools.

Students have assessed and valued the impact of these study-skill workshops and have requested for the same for the students of Std. 9th as well.

# The "G" Class

"Can the workshops be never-ending?" students often ask the mentors. What will happen if the school also followed teaching patterns similar to the workshops? Can't we extend the twice a month meets to weekly or daily interactions?

As mentors, we dream of what can be achieved if a group of 75 Gifted girls are working continuously on their academics, extracurricular projects, constantly productive interactions and lesser peer distractions?


The G Class will witness the same syllabus taught in a unique way. There will be international teacher training programs, and post-school hour interactions, project work, weekend workshops, study circles and many guest lectures by experts from varied fields. This is another promising feather in TMNP's cap!

One of the traits of giftedness is high leadership ability. It's among these young nurtured gifted minds that our tomorrows leaders are in the making. At what age does this quality express itself? The sibling who takes care of the entire household, can he/she be a leader? The school student who takes various initiatives at school level, can he/ she be a leader? Graduates who opt for a career in management or social work can they be termed as leaders? What stops a leader or what opportunity motivates a leader to come forward?

With this thought in mind, TMNP introduced its leadership program in 2018-19. With the support of Being Human - The Salman Khan Foundation, TMNP launched a youth program in 2017-18, which enrolled students pursuing graduation from Science/ Arts / Commerce streams or adopting for specialisations like Nursing or Vocational studies.

The leadership program was introduced to participants from YUVA program, as well as to some TMNP Alumni, who are currently pursuing their graduation.

- 1. Providing financial and network support to students who wish to use their Giftedness for the societal welfare.
- 2. Involving students, parents, mentors, as well as company HRs as part of a long-term commitment towards the project.

Challenges faced during the initiative:

- Round-the-clock tuition classes or part-time jobs
- 2. Students are set on following the trends of entrances such as Medical/ IPSC/ UPSC
- 3. Students were not ready to opt for long term commitments.
- 4. Parents were concerned about personal events in students' life such as marriage and career.
- 5. Students lacked ambition towards various projects introduced to them.

# TMNP - Setbacks

### **TMNP Vanchit:**

One of our projects in association with Snehalaya, Ahmednagar, had to be put on hold due to some unforeseen factors. TMNP has identified 19 gifted. The group belonged to a critical background. Some of the kids are affected by HIV AIDS, some are kids of commercial sex workers. The resultant student psychology required very specific expertise while interacting with this special group. The group of students who needed to be addressed, required special attention and experience,. TMNP is developing the same. Within year or so TMNP will start catering this special group.

### TMNP Pali:

Another project of ours, in association with Tribal School of Chive, Vavloli & Padsare in Pali region, has not been able to take-off due to lack of funding for the past two years. We are constantly taking efforts to generate funding for this project from this region, so that we can start helping these gifted students from this region, as promised.



# The Next Step

TMNP - Sevadham Tribal Residential School

TMNP has adopted a Tribal Residential school with 438 tribal kids.

"Identifying & nurturing the gifted for the benefit of the society!" This has been the philosophy of TMNP. We have been consistently putting efforts into the first two goals and now it is time to focus on societal benefits. **TMNP has now adopted Sevadham Tribal Residential School for next 3 years.** TMNP will strive to use its international presence to assist Sevadham In making the best of this opportunity. Shifting from the classroom environment & students into actually working with the Tribal communities, their livelihood is quite challenging. 

### ECHA Thematic Conference, Croatia, October 2019



A true success story makes us proud for 2 of our Alumni from TMNP - YUVA project- Ms. Chinmayee Kulkarni and Mr. Mayuri Lokhande has shown achievements beyond the national borders. They have been working with TMNP since 2018 and have the TMNP model while assisting with the nurturing workshops.

Their research abstracts have been selected for the European Centre for High Ability (ECHA) Thematic conference in Croatia, which is to be held in October 2019.

Chinmayee will be developing an exclusive tool to assess the students participating in TMNP nurturing workshops, to evaluate their power of will, action and knowledge and its impact with respect to their Panchakosha.

Mayuri will be presenting the impact and efficiency of the new TMNP Initiative "Overnight Nurturing Workshops" and about how these workshops have an additional edge over the Pullout Programs that last for only a few hours. She will be developing a "Nurturing Web Structure" to assess the impact of overnight workshops which will help in standardisation of the same.

Another abstract on "Gifted Counselling for the Underprivileged", by Sampada Deshpande & Dr. Devasena Desai will also be presented through this platform.



TMNP Self Sustaining System: TMNP has always tried to be self reliant, self-sufficient and self sustaining. The first & foremost step is to build your second cadre, who will take the responsibility of Giftedness identification, nurturing and most importantly devote their time voluntarily. Prachiti, Akshata, Tejaswini (from Sarswati Vidya Mandir, Talegaon) similarly Chaitrali, Neha (from Vama project Pune), Trupti, Chinmayee, Mayuri, Tejaswini (from Yuva Project) have started working voluntarily.

In year 2018-19, they conducted four overnight workshops at MKSSS Wai and Pune. Along with these activities they also participated in day workshops, giftedness assessments and fund raising. Getting inspiration from the work, Chinmayee and Mayuri started working on Research projects, Akshata and Chaitrali are creating study skill workshop material, Prachiti is devoting her time to the Wishlist & budget for the Sevadham, Tribal Residential School Project. Neha Upasani is mentoring 20th standard girls from MKSSS. Tejaswini, a student of Bharatnatyam is developing giftedness assessment & nurturing program in the field of arts & performance.

These events are really inspiring. Similarly voluntary efforts are being made at Satara and Talegaon. More and More volunteering gifted kids are emerging and sure this work will take forward.


